a. Updates on the launching gates, Owsley Electric came back out and redid the quote for all of the launching gates that need to be fixed. The quote included adding WIFI gate card reader system. There are 3 power poles at Old Ruth that need to be replaced in order to fix the power at the Old Ruth gate. These poles are shared by a leaseholder and hoping to work together to restore the power for the lease and Old Ruth gate.

9. Manager's Report and Update:

- a. Financial: Recognize and Acknowledge Documents
- b. Community Hall: We have few requests for use of the hall. STVFD will be holding their St. Patrick's Day drive through dinner on March 20th. The window has been repaired that was broken in the kitchen.
- c. Marina: Boating permit are not needed to rent a patio boat. Looking into to see if the Marina employees may need a boating card to drive boats on to the lake.
- d. Campground: Campground reservations begin on March 15, 2021 at 8:00am. Boy Scout will be opening for camping on May 15, 2021. Barlow will be closed this year to the public. It is being used as a debris removal transfer landing. Some trailers will be staying in Barlow for \$15 a night per trailer. Hobart Creek Campground will be not available to the public, it is being used for the loggers and some of the debris removal teams.
- e. Leases: Many questions from lease holders about the process on restoring power poles. A lot of requests for rebuilding and improvements have been received.
- f. Buffer Strip: Lots of trees being removed on the buffer strip. Many of them being P2 trees.
